The week in review

### Murder In Israeli Town

Two teenaged girls, Hadas Turjeman and Linoi Sarousi, were murdered Tuesday night by an Arab terrorist, as they stood talking outside one of their homes. The murderer climbed under a fence in the northern Shomron community of Hermesh, shot the two girls, and then entered another home and fatally shot Orna Eshel, 53. Her husband was also shot, and was taken to Hillel Yaffe Hospital in Hadera in "moderate" condition, where he learned of his wife's death.

A woman resident of the town tried to shoot the terrorist, but did not succeed. Soldiers who arrived on the scene then shot and killed him; one of them was lightly wounded. The terrorist used a Kalachnikov assault rifle, and was also wearing an explosives belt that he apparently hoped to detonate and cause more deaths.

The Sarousi family, had wanted to leave, but Linoi told her parents that she, in any event, would not go.

### Israeli Arab 'Lynch'

An Israeli Arab was taken into custody Tuesday on suspicion of having taken part in the 'lynch' attack against an Israeli vehicle at Beit El Junction about four years ago. An IDF soldier and a civilian were traveling, when bombarded by stone-throwers and eventually pulled from their vehicle. The two eventually managed to flee the bloodthirsty mob.

### Terrorist In Ariel

Three soldiers were killed in a gas station outside Ariel, Sunday, when a human bomb blew himself up close to a group of soldiers. The Arab terrorist was spotted before the explosion, some soldiers wrestled with him and shot him, but he still managed to detonate his bomb. About 20 people were wounded, including three who are listed in serious condition.

Ariel, one of the largest towns in Yesha with about 20,000 residents, is located in central Shomron, less than 20 miles east of Tel Aviv. The murderer was later reported to be a 19-year-old resident of Shechem, about eight miles northeast of Ariel. IDF sources reported that the attack was enabled by the decision to ease security measures in the vicinity, and that "each time security measures are eased, it is exploited by the PA for terrorist attacks."

At times, this situation borders on the ridiculous. To cite a case in point: In the midst of the Lebanon War, Lebanese Christians murdered hundreds of Palestinians at the refugee camps of Sabra and Shatilla. To prevent these killings from taking place, Israeli soldiers would have had to risk their own lives.

How did Israel react to the killings? She volunteered to take the blame. And so loud was their protest that a Commission of Inquiry was established, which made recommendations resulting in a shuffling of the Israeli Cabinet and Army High Command.

## STUFF you should know

### Canadian Connection

The Shin Bet security service recently arrested an explosives expert who had been sent to the PA by Hizbullah to help local Hamas and Islamic Jihad cells plan terror attacks and prepare bombs. Fawzi Ayub, a Shiite Muslim from Lebanon with Canadian citizenship, was arrested at the end of June in Hebron.

The arrest of the Hizbullah agent was originally reported in Yediot Aharonot on June 27. According to the paper's sources at the time, the terrorist was a high-level agent and Prime Minister Ariel Sharon updated U.S. Secretary of State Colin Powell on the man's capture.

According to information now released for publication, Ayub entered Israel in October 2000 on a Canadian passport. He was sent by Hizbullah to train Hamas and Islamic Jihad terrorists how to plan terror attacks and prepare professional explosive devices in quantities the Palestinian organizations were not familiar with.

Ayub was recruited by Hizbullah while he was still in Canada, the paper said. He spent a long time in Lebanon training for his mission as part of the Hizbullah's
