The week in review

### Five Injured in Jerusalem Blasts

Two explosions went off Thursday in a quiet ultra-Orthodox Jewish neighborhood of Jerusalem, and at least five people were injured, police and paramedics said.

The injuries were light, officials said. The blasts were probably caused by a car bomb, said Jerusalem police spokesman Shmuel Ben-Ruby. However, police said the car caught fire before exploding, raising the possibility of mechanical trouble as well.

Shimon Hagai, a witness, said parts of the car flew up to the height of about four stories. He said the explosions were 20 seconds apart. Clouds of smoke rose high into the air.

Moshe Suissa, operations officer of the Jerusalem Fire Department, said a bystander standing near the car at the time of the blast was among the injured.

### IDF forces neutralize explosive devices in Gaza

Two explosive devices were safely neutralized by Israeli forces north of the Kissufim checkpoint in Gaza on Tuesday. An explosive device was found near the border fence and later in the day, a second device was noticed in proximity of the same location. Bomb-demolition experts attached to the border police neutralized both devices without incident.

### Bezeq base attacked by gunfire

The IDF's Bezeq base, south of the PA autonomous areas of Jenin, was attacked by gunfire on Tuesday night. There were no reported casualties. Soldiers returned fire.

### Israeli Arab assaulted by PA forces

An Israeli Arab citizen on Tuesday night told Israeli soldiers as a checkpoint near Kalandia, north of Jerusalem, that PA security forces had assaulted him.

The Arab man, an Israeli citizen, explained that he was beaten by PA police after entering into the nearby PA autonomous area. The man was transported to a Jerusalem hospital.

### Who is Mr. Arafat ?

When President Clinton invited Arafat to the White House for direct negotiations on the Middle East, Welsh says, that was the last straw. He has been on a personal one-man mission to uncover the tape recordings and transcripts of those intercepts between Arafat and Fatah leader Salah Khalaf, also known as Abu-Iyad, in Beirut and Khalil al-Wazir in Khartoum.

Welsh thinks the American people, who are footing much of the bill for Arafat's current activities, have a right to know about his personal responsibility for the murder of two Americans. And he is the first American involved directly in the affair to charge publicly what has long been rumored -- that Arafat ordered the embassy takeover and the murders of the American diplomats.

"I have decided that my oaths of secrecy must give way to my sense of right and wrong," I was particularly outraged as I had spent four years following these individuals and, at the moment of our greatest intelligence coup against them, an uninformed CS level had pooh-poohed our work and cost the lives of two U.S. diplomats," he recalls.

Welsh immediately began demanding answers about the breakdown in communication that led to the tragedy.

"After some effort, I was told that the choice was mine: Shut up or lose my clearance and get ready for Fleet Oiler duty within 48 hours," he said. "I gave in."
