The week in review

### Midnight Run

After Israel pulled out of Gaza in middle of the night, Palestinians fired two rounds of mortar shells, towards the Jewish communities in Gaza Wednesday. Two shells fell in the schoolyard of N'vei Dekalim. In addition, a bomb was found Wednesday on the road between Kibbutz Nachal Oz and Gaza; it was safely detonated by army sappers. At around 2 PM, a large IDF bulldozer, accompanied by a tank and an armed personnel carrier, penetrated about 500 meters into PA-controlled Gaza, destroyed the building from which the shells were fired, and left the area. ### An Orphan Of "Peace"

On Monday, Irena Nourezitz, the widow of IDF reservist, Corporal Vadim Nourezitz, gave birth to a baby boy on Monday.

Cpl. Nourezitz, 33, was killed in a bloody lynch in the PA autonomous city of

Ramallah along with reservist Sgt.-Major Yosef Avrahami, also 33, after they made a wrong turn and entered an area under PA control on October 12, 2000. Their bodies were torn apart by the Arab mob. (INN)

### Stocking Up For What ?

Carmiel District police working with military police uncovered a weapons cache in the Israeli Arab village of Beit Jon. Among the items recovered by police were an M-16 automatic rifle, stun grenades, bullets and other unspecified military hardware. (INN)

### A Concrete Education

Minister of Defense Binyamin Ben-Eliezer on Thursday ordered that prefabricated caravans being utilized as classrooms throughout the Gaza Coast Regional Council be replaced by reinforced concrete structures capable of withstanding shooting attacks. (INN)

### Life In The Capital

The IDF position on HaAnafa Street in the southern Jerusalem neighborhood of Gilo was attacked by gunfire on Wednesday. (INN)

## STUFF you should know

### Warnings Come True

Research by INN correspondents Ariel Kahane and Yosef Mantinband has turned up the following anti-Oslo warnings:

Then-Likud MK Moshe Katzav said during the fateful Knesset session in which the Oslo Agreement was accepted in September '93: "Tell me please, Mr. Foreign Minister [Peres] and Mr. Defense Minister [Rabin, who was also Prime Minister], how will you prevent a little van traveling within Arafat's Yesha areas from loading up with katyushas and shooting towards the coastal cities? How will you prevent [katyushas from being shot towards] Ashkelon, Netivot, Sderot, Ofakim, and Ashdod?"

In December 1996, Arutz-7's Kobi Finkler reported that Yasser Arafat had issued "clear instructions for every Palestinian to buy weapons from wherever he can - from Israel or from elsewhere, to smuggle, buy, or steal... and to obtain heavy guns - preferably Kalachnikov rifles..."

But there was at least one person who didn't believe the warnings, and even mocked them: Yitzchak Rabin. In 1995, he scornfully said: "We know all the scare-stories of the Likud. They promised [when the first Oslo agreement was signed] that there would be katyushas from Gaza. It's been a year already that the Gaza is mostly under PA control, and there haven't been any katyushas, and there won't be any... The Likud is simply scared to death of peace, and for this reason is reacting in a truly childish manner."
