### A Rabbi At Work

Rabbi Aharon Abadian, 41, father of four, was murdered Tuesday within the Green Line near the northwestern Shomron while he was performing his duties as Rabbinical Kashrut supervisor in the local Arab market. His friend Rafi Menat told INN that Rabbi Abadian was a volunteer in the local Hatzalah [rescue] organization, and was one of the leaders in the Chief Rabbinate's new department of Kashrut Supervision in the Arab sector. "He had considered leaving the job several times," Menat said, "but he felt that he was fulfilling an important role for Israel."

The police agreed to forego an autopsy, and many hundreds participated in his late-night funeral in his hometown of Zikhron Yaakov

### A Shepard Murdered

Thousands of people attended the funeral Tuesday of Ya'ir Har-Sinai brutally murdered by Arabs Monday while grazing his sheep.

### A Father On His Way Home

Avi (ben Shula Aziza) Romano, father of seven, was shot only 100 meters before reaching his Shomron community of Brachah Monday evening. He is now listed as moderate condition.

### The Daily Miracles

The IDF reported Tuesday morning that several particularly grave terrorist attacks were thwarted over the past few days. One of the terrorists killed Sunday night in Jenin, Muhmad Bashrat, was about to dispatch two suicide attackers to Kfar Sabá; another attack was planned for Ashkelon; and the bomb that was detonated alongside a busload of military cadets was in fact a very large 25-kilogram load. The fact that no one was hurt in that case is viewed as a miracle.

### A promise that endangers the security of 3 million Jews

After seeing the entire process, and the results of returning the territories for a signature on a peace agreement, they continue to talk and to act in the same vein concerning Yehuda and Shomron! They began with nautical issues, followed by the entire expanse of the Sinai, the oil wells etc. And the hope is to continue with this until the areas of Yehuda and Shomron [are discussed], and they even contemplate concerning Jerusalem!... While there are none who oppose it or who raise any objection whatsoever! The argument is that they have, so to speak, committed themselves at Camp David, and thus there is no choice, for they must keep up appearances to the world that Jews are a "straightforward people" upon whom it is possible to rely, whose promise is indeed a promise...

### The Only Option

Brig.-Gen. (res.) Dr. Aryeh Eldad has been saying for months that the only solution to the present situation is an all-out war. He elaborated on this point for INN Tuesday:"

How exactly this war will take place, whether it will be with tanks or planes, or what the exact missions will be, will have to be decided at the proper echelons... But the goals of the war have to be clear, and one of these must be defined as ensuring that no other Arab political entity will be established west of the Jordan - and that there must be many less Arabs west of the Jordan after the war. If this is not clear, then those who say that 'there's no purpose in fighting since in any event after it's over we'll have to sit down and talk' are right... It's true that there could be a high price of casualties, as in any war, but the longer we push this off, the higher will be the price. The Arabs have a clear strategy of threatening our very existence, in that they will block our reservists from getting to bases and preventing the army from defending its citizens. We must pay the price now, so that it will not be ten times higher later."
